The Rise and Rebuild Foundation is committed to aiding the poor and the malnourished in the Philippine Islands—with the building of communal bathrooms. The Rise and Rebuild Foundation focuses on the nutrition of malnourished children, from birth through secondary school. They also drill potable water wells, build nutrition centers from the bricks made at their own facilities, and operate garden centers. The establishment of large gardens provides free vegetables for the nutrition centers and needed employment for people from local Philippino villages.

Global Foodbanking Network helps to establish food supplies for areas worldwide, training volunteers and employees to manage critical operational functions.

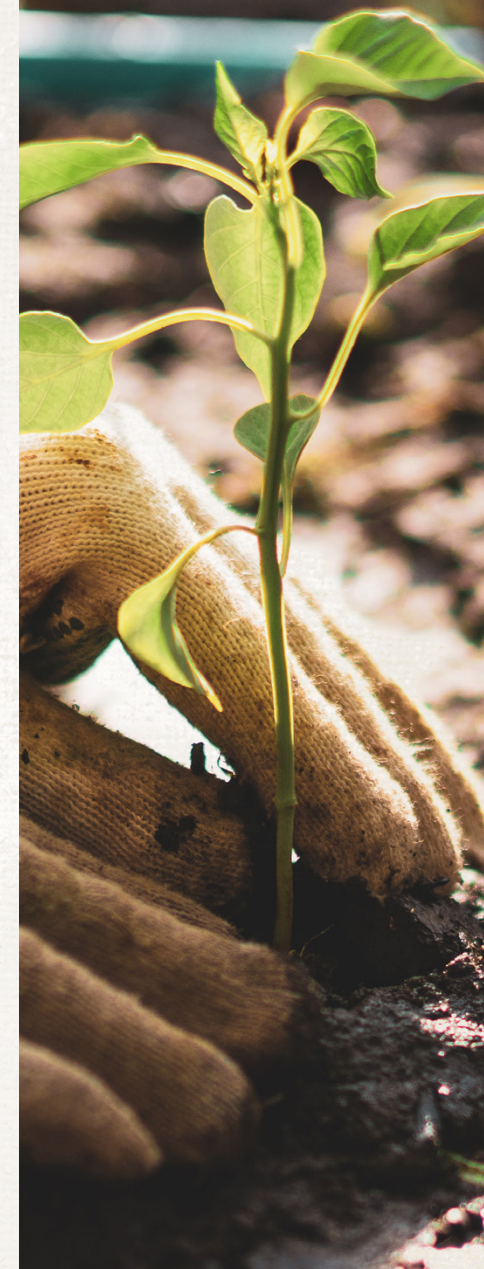

GFN helps supply chains shore up inventory and secure donations of essential food staples to meet increasing demand through contingency planning for at-risk groups: households in quarantine, individuals isolated or working remotely, and families whose children are usually fed at school.

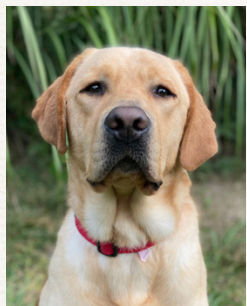


2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



OPERATION UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Our work with O.U.R. in the fight against human trafficking continued across the world in 2020. We funded the training of another police dog, named Jab, who graduated and was placed in the North Dakota Bureau of Criminal Investigation with special agent



Cassidy Halseth. Jab has already helped with five search warrants, finding **13 electronic devices** containing crucial evidence and leading to the **arrest of three suspects**.

Even with COVID-19 shutdowns dramatically decreasing the number of search warrants issued to investigate crimes against children, Advancing Life-sponsored police dogs still had a successful year. Banner assisted in **five arrests** and **one rescue** in Alabama, ALF assisted in **five arrests** in Florida, and Champ assisted in **two arrests** in Missouri.

The Foundation also funded the buildout of a new center to investigate internet crimes against children (ICAC) in Ukraine. This ICAC center is the first of its kind in Europe and had far-reaching results after only its first few months. To date, the center has **rescued 425** victims of human trafficking and **arrested nine perpetrators**.

CHOICE HUMANITARIAN

The Inta Kara vocational center in Ecuador expanded campus construction to include a second building! With our continued financial backing, the buildout of the Inta Kara technical center now includes a kitchen and cafeteria, now in use for culinary classes.



The culinary art courses have been in great demand from the community and are benefiting women in the surrounding area. Each student will receive a certification once they complete the two-month course.

Despite COVID restrictions, the school has proven successful, with many classes shifting to a virtual learning environment. The third welding course of 15 students was also completed this year through in-person training.

In addition to the culinary and welding courses, students can take metrology or mechanical drawing classes. These new certification courses will benefit their communities greatly, both in skills rendered to others as well as an economic boost.

2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



VISION CAMBODIA

In October, major flooding occurred in Cambodia, which destroyed the rice crop for the year and left thousands of people without food. More than 131,000 houses were damaged or destroyed, and over 12,200 households were displaced. Thanks to our partnership with Vision Cambodia, the Advancing Life Foundation responded to the crisis by providing a **month's supply of food to more than 600 families**.

Advancing Life® donors also provided a total of **95 new wells** to families in need over the year, bringing the total number of wells donated through ASEA® donors and the Advancing Life Foundation to 150.

With two service expeditions consisting of **45 volunteers** in February and March, 12 new gardens were planted. Two schools were painted with a third school repaired, and 216 newborn kits were assembled and donated to local medical clinics.

2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



DISASTER RELIEF

At the advent of COVID-19 in early 2020, the foundation assisted new partner Samaritan's Purse with ICU medical field tents in Cremona, Italy, and New York City. These medical tents served as overflow treatment beds for COVID-19 patients as the hospitals were filled to capacity. Samaritan's Purse provided additional beds and equipment for patients, but they also provided trained medical professionals to treat those that were suffering.

One of the tragic byproducts of the pandemic is the dramatic increase in families suffering from food insecurity. Many families across the globe found themselves in situations where they didn't have enough food.

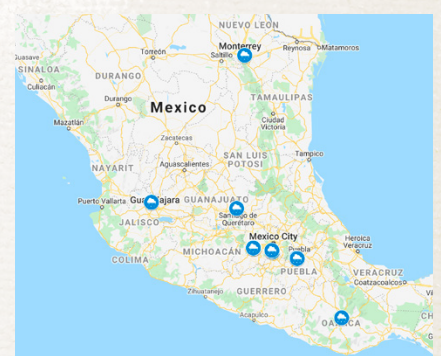
The ASEA Advancing Life® Foundation partnered with several charitable foundations that work specifically with food insecurities, such as Feeding America, with whom we worked to provide **500,000 meals** in the United States. In the Philippines, we partnered with Rise & Rebuild to offer fresh fruit and vegetables in more than **10,000 meals a day**. Lastly, we formed a partnership with the Global Foodbanking Network to help stock food banks located in Central America and Southeast Asia.

In 2020, the foundation also worked through the Salvation Army to help victims of category 4 hurricane Laura in Louisiana, as well victims of the Northern California wildfires.



TECHO

Our newest partnership, TECHO funded the installation of **10 rain harvesting systems** in the community centers of **10 rural villages** across Mexico. With installations completed before the start of the rainy season, 588,700 liters of clean water can now be stored for use in these villagers, benefiting 175,350 people. TECHO also **installed 35 handwashing stations** in key locations in the villages to help contain the spread of germs. Villagers were trained on sanitation and the importance of handwashing. These efforts will help to curb the spread of COVID-19 in these communities.



2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



H.A.I.M.A.D

For the annual ASEA® Have An Impact Make A Difference (H.A.I.M.A.D) day, ASEA employees donated blood through ARUP. Blood donations decreased by 30% in 2020 during the COVID-19 shutdowns. However, the need for blood did not decrease. ASEA held a successful blood drive with several first-time donors.

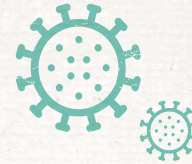
With school drinking fountains shut down to stop the spread of germs, many students from low-income areas were not getting adequate hydration because they couldn't provide their own reusable water bottle.



The donation of **500 ASEA® water bottles** to a Title 1 school in Salt Lake City provided a simple means of relief to these families. Every child in the school received a water bottle.

We will continue to support initiatives that either prevent victims from being lured into human trafficking or to help rescue victims and arrest perpetrators. We plan to fund another rescue mission in 2021, provide training for another police dog, and support the work of a new mobile forensic lab.



CLEAN WATER

One in three people in the world do not have access to clean water. We will continue to support the installation of wells and systems that can provide clean water.



EDUCATION

We will continue to support initiatives that provide education to communities that do not currently have access.
